Neighbourhood Partnership	Current Position
Hartcliffe, Whitchurch Park, Bishopsworth	<p>Previously a Local Leadership Group (LLG), new working arrangements are currently being planned with members. A considerable ratio of the three-ward area is covered by the Neighbourhood Management (NM) project, managed by Hartcliffe and Withywood Community Partnership (HWCP). Members are keen to ensure that NP work does not interfere with or duplicate the the work plan of HWCP.</p> <p>Officers and members met with the board of HWCP on 5th December 2007 to agree progress. It was agreed that the NP would explore having area-based reps from outside of the current HWCP border, plus reps from the HWCP board working with the NP to identify issues and priorities. Knowle, Windmill Hill, Filwood	<p>Previously an LLG, new working arrangements currently being planned with members. The Filwood NM project covering all people living in Filwood but also a small number of streets in Knowle and Windmill Hill is a project of considerable interest to all councillors in this NP.</p> <p>Councillors have expressed a strong preference for concentrating on their individual wards for the time being, but have requested that an open public meeting that brings together all local service providers at the same event be organised for local people. The BCC Community Engagement Team is planning to hold this event (under the banner of the NP) in March 2008. Lockleaze, Horfield	<p>NP planning currently underway. Launch date Monday 3rd March 2008. There is currently an NR action Plan covering most of Lockleaze and part of Horfield. The Balanced and Sustainable Communities project is also currently being developed. Members wish to retain the priorities identified in these areas. Greater Bedminster Community Partnership. Bedminster, Southville	<p>This is an independent community partnership. Local councillors have a defined role on partnership that fits well with NP role. GBCP has an Action Plan in operation. The support role the Community Engagement Team can offer is currently being developed. This partnership offers a potential template for future NP work across Bristol. Current priorities for the GBCP include improving green spaces; quality of life for older people; traffic issues. There are a number of groups affiliated to the GBCP that are working on specific issues in the area, for example Friends of Greville Smythe Park. Brislington Community Partnership. Brislington East, West	<p>This is an independent Community Partnership supported by all four local councillors. The partnership priorities form the Brislington Community Action Plan, which were developed via a number of consultation exercises. Priorities include: Environment, particularly litter and dog fouling; employment - Brislington is perceived to offer part-time and casual employment in the retail sector.
