A Labour Government will work for women and will:

- Commit to a 50/50 gender balance in the Cabinet
- Monitor social class in the public sector
- Appoint a dedicated Violence against Women and Girls Commissioner
- Introduce comprehensive Sex and Relationships Education for all children
- Bring back legislation against third party harassment that the Coalition removed
- Protect maternity pay
- Expand free childcare for 3 and 4 year olds to from 15 to 25 hours a week

- Repeal the Health and Social Care Act and stop the insidious privatisation of the NHS
- Invest £2.5bn in a 'time to care' fund. 5000 new care workers in integrated teams will provide 'whole person care' to help people to stay in their own homes longer
- Introduce 8,000 more GPs and 20,000 more nurses
- Introduce guaranteed GP appointments in 48 hours
