***PrEP** is a pill you can take to prevent you from contracting HIV. Please note to apply for this role you do not need to be an expert in PrEP as you will receive full training!





Peer Mobiliser Role Description

Position: Peer Mobiliser

Time Commitment: June – September

Start Date: June 2019 *Must be available for training on Friday 21st & Saturday 22nd June 10am – 4pm

Expectations of volunteers:

- To deliver sexual health messages to your peers, communities and/or networks
- To be in regular contact with the Peer Coordinator
- To adhere to Brigstowe's policies and procedures, including our confidentiality policy.

Skills and Experience:

- To self-identify as a woman
- Be part of a network/community or have peers you can access & who would benefit from sexual health messages
- To have leadership qualities
- An interest in peer education/peer support
- An interest in sexual health & HIV prevention, including PrEP
- A non-judgemental approach and an empathetic manner
- Good time management & organizational skills
- Respect for diversity & commitment to equal opportunities

Training & Support Provided:

- Full training & induction
- Regular 1-2-1 support from the Peer Coordinator
- Reimbursement for out-of-pocket expenses (up to a reasonable amount)

Transferable skills and experience gained from participating:

- An understanding of PrEP, HIV prevention methods and sexual health
- Increased confidence, communication and presentation skills
- An opportunity to support good sexual health & wellbeing in your community
